Appropriate attire

In an effort to provide a learning environment free from unnecessary distraction, all clothes should be worn in the way they were meant to be worn. All shirts should cover the midriff area. Undergarments should not be visible. No hats, including bandanas, may be worn. All logos and print should be appropriate for elementary children. If attire presents a distraction or disruption to the learning environment, the principal or dean may meet with the child to solve the problem and may contact the parent. Please help your child in deciding on suitable clothing to wear to school.



Traffic Guidelines for Arrival and Dismissal

All students should be arriving between 8:00 and 8:10 for breakfast in the classroom. It is normal for there to be a little traffic congestion during arrival and dismissal at elementary schools. We appreciate your patience and everything you can do to follow our guidelines so that we are ensuring safety for all. Below are the established procedures we would like you to follow. Thanks again for your cooperation.



- Our bus lane off E. Walnut is for buses and daycare vans only.
- Please use our main entrance off of E. 16th St. for loading and unloading your students. This section is a ONE WAY with ONE LANE to ensure we are not blocking the parking spots for those needing to enter the building. HOWEVER, YOU MAY NOT LEAVE YOUR CAR or park for long periods of time unless you are in a parking spot.
- You may also use the parking spots on Capitol to drop off your child.
- If you plan to enter the building around dismissal or arrival time you will need to park in the parking areas on the east or north side of Capitol View or on the street. I know that many of you like to greet your child at the door, but if your cars are parked out front you are preventing the traffic from flowing smoothly. We will bring your children out to you.
- It is best to have your children meet you outside after school. The kindergarten teachers dismiss from their outside classroom doors near the north east corner of our building. Our 1st and 2nd graders are dismissed out of our south doors on the front (east side) of our building and our 3rd-5th graders dismiss out of our main door on the east side.
- Always be mindful of other parents and drivers when picking up your students. Please allow for at least 15 minutes as it can get congested when almost 600 students are arriving and dismissing. Your patience and understanding is appreciated.
- It can be very helpful to have a spot that your child knows you will be when picking up after school.
- Please be respectful of the Capitol View neighbors and do not park in, or block, their driveways.
- School doors open at 8:00 in the morning and school dismisses at 3:00. Please do not come before 2:50 unless you are parking in the lot.
- Thank you for your cooperation and patience which will help us keep our children safe.

Is your child responsible? Are you up to date on school events? The monthly newsletters are
packed with important information. Please watch for them around the first of every month. Ask you
child for it. If you do not get a copy, contact your child's teacher or the school office. They are also

PATRON NOTIFICATION

Between District Open Enrollment

Iowa Administrative Code 281-17.3(2)

Parents/Guardians considering the use of the open enrollment option to enroll their children in <u>another</u> public school district in the state of Iowa should be aware of the following dates:

DEADLINES:

March 1, 2016 is the last date for regular open enrollment requests for the 2016-2017 school year.

September 1, 2016 is the last date for open enrollment requests for entering kindergarten students and those students falling under the "good cause" definition for the 2016-2017 school year. To insure that the transfer of individual students does not adversely affect the diversity plan of the District, certain limitations to open enrollment have been established. Parents of kindergarten students are therefore encouraged to make application requests prior to March 1, 2016.

APPEALS:

Within 30 days of a denial of an open enrollment request by the DMPS Board of Education, a parent/guardian may file an appeal with the state board of education only if the open enrollment request was based on repeated acts of harassment or a serious health condition of the student that the district cannot adequately address. All other denials must be appealed to the district court in Polk County.

ATHLETIC ELIGIBILITY:

In most cases, a high school student who open enrolls is <u>ineligible</u> for varsity athletic competition during the student's first 90 consecutive school days of enrollment in the receiving district. Some, but not all, exceptions to this general rule of ineligibility are as follows:

The sending district does not offer the sport in question.

The sending district was dissolved and merged with one or more other districts.

The sending district whole-grade shares with another district for the student's grade level.

TRANSPORTATION:

Parents/Guardians of students open enrolled <u>from another school district</u> are eligible for transportation assistance if the household income of the parent/guardian is at or below the federal poverty guidelines for household size. <u>The two districts must be contiguous</u>. Assistance may be in the form of actual transportation or in the form of a cash stipend. Information regarding transportation eligibility and a complete copy of the District's open enrollment policy and procedures may be obtained from the Open Enrollment Office, 1301 Second Ave., Des Moines, Iowa 50314
