Cell Phones



According to district policy, elementary students are not to have cell phones at school. This includes working and nonworking cell phones. If you feel your child needs a phone for the route to and from school they should not be removed from the

backpack while on school property. The school is not responsible for damage or loss. If you have questions or concerns about this please contact Mrs. Kerper or Mr. Sharkey at 242-8402.

Appropriate attire

In an effort to provide a learning environment free from unnecessary distraction, all clothes should be worn in the way they were meant to be worn. All shirts should cover the midriff area. Undergarments should not be visible. No hats, including bandanas, may be worn. All logos and print should be appropriate for elementary children. If attire presents a distraction or disruption to the learning environment, the principal or dean may meet with the child to solve the problem and may contact the parent. Please help your child in deciding on suitable clothing to wear to school. Thank you.

Telephone Messages

Capitol View school is able to send computer-generated phone calls to every student's home. Most of you are familiar with this from past years. In order to save paper and printing costs we will be using this process frequently for school reminders and emergencies. Please contact the school office if you are not receiving these calls. Also please keep us updated of any phone number changes.

In addition, please remember to leave messages on our answering machine regarding student absences. You may leave messages any time of the day or night. If you can leave messages before 7:45 a.m. it helps to cut down on the morning busyness in the office. Thanks!

Traffic Guidelines for Arrival and Dismissal

Back to school time means we need to get the kids to and from school safely and efficiently. Please read through the directions below and remember it is important that all parents and students follow these procedures at the beginning and end of each school day. Ask your child's teacher if you have any questions. PLEASE NOTE THERE ARE CHANGES FROM LAST YEAR.



Procedures:

Students who are dropped off:

All students who are dropped off at Capitol View must be dropped off in the driveway on the east side of the building. The entrance to this driveway is on East 16th Street. All dropped off students will enter the building through the front doors. The area on East Capitol is reserved for busses.

Students who walk to school:

All students who are walking to Capitol View need to cross Capitol Avenue and Walnut Street at the intersections with crossing guards. Students need to stay on the sidewalks while walking up to the building and enter the building through the front doors.

K-1st student and sibling pick-up:

All K-1 students and their siblings will be picked up on the east side of the building, next to East 16th St.

Parents will pull up so as many cars as possible can fit into the driveway. If a student is not ready to be picked up, the parents will drive all the way through the lot and come back through, not to back up traffic.

For the safety of all students, teachers will only release students who are picked up in the drive-up lanes. We will not allow students to walk through the parking lots to the street.

2nd - 5th student pick-up:

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All 2nd- 5th grade students will be picked up on the south side of the building, next to Walnut St.

Parents will pull up so as many cars as possible can fit into the driveway. If a student is not ready to be picked up, the parents will drive all the way through the lot and come back through, not to back up traffic.

For the safety of all students, teachers will only release students who are picked up in the drive-up lanes. We will not allow students to walk through the parking lots to the street.

Please remember school doors do not open until 8:00 in the morning and school dismisses at 3:10. When almost 600 students are arriving and dismissing, it can get a bit congested. Your patience and understanding is appreciated.

Is your child responsible? Are you up to date on school events? The monthly newsletters are packed with important information. Please watch for them around the first of every month. Ask your child for it. If you do not get a copy, contact your child's teacher or the school office. They are also available on our school website at http://capitolview.dmschools.org/
