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A Note From Mrs. Kerper

Dear Families,

We have had a great start to the new school year. The Breakfast in the Classroom program has been a wonderful addition for Capitol View. I hope your children are enjoying having breakfast with their classmates. Please remember that students need to arrive BEFORE 8:15 to receive breakfast.

Along those lines, we continue to work on our district goal of 95% attendance every day. While we are not meeting that as often as we should, I am seeing improvement. Last week we hit 98.9% two days in a row and one day with only 3 tardies! That is phenomenal! Hopefully your children have been talking to you about our attendance goals. Children receive a tag for their attendance necklace for each month they have perfect attendance. We will be handing out August tags very soon. In addition, whenever a student earns their second month of perfect attendance they will earn a pair of cool Capitol View sunglasses. After the 5th month they will receive a Capitol View water bottle.



Hopefully your child has a plan that he/she follows EVERY day regarding how to get home. It is helpful to your child and to us if there is a set routine. We understand that on some rare occasions there is an **emergency** or plans need to be changed, but we cannot relay messages on a regular basis. Please make these plans with your child before they come to school and help us to keep instructional time free from distractions. Also, please sign children out early only in cases of emergency. Phone calls to classrooms, announcements, and students leaving early can be highly disruptive. In addition, your child will miss a lot of information by leaving just 10 or 15 minutes early. Please help us to protect instructional time.

Parent/Teacher conferences were held on August 27th and will finish up on September 3rd. Your attendance is an essential part of your child's school success. This is an important time to talk with your child's teacher about goals for the year and to plan how school and home can work together to help your child make great progress. Education is a team effort. If you were not able to attend or need to reschedule, please contact your child's teacher. It is important to your child.

I hope your child has settled into the new school year and is enjoying his/her teachers, classmates and learning. Don't hesitate to contact me if you have any questions or concerns. Enjoy the upcoming fall break and beautiful fall weather with your children.

It also can help prevent you from having future problems with our attendance committee due to lack of reporting your child's absenc-

Infinite Campus Student/Parent Portal

Des Moines Public Schools uses Infinite Campus as its web-based student information system. The service provides students the ability to access their class related information as well as allowing a parent / guardian the ability to view their children's academic information.

Who has access to the Student/Parent Portal?

Student's grades 6th through 12th have access. Their login information is available at their respective schools they attend.

Parents/Guardians who have been designated as having legal rights to their children may request a parent portal account. Each parent / guardian will have their **own** unique account that can be used to gain access to student records they have legal rights to.

How to establish a Student/Parent Portal account?

If you do not have an activation key please contact the office. As a privacy and security precaution, we will request you to provide some form of ID. We will give you an activation key and directions.

As a parent, do I need my own account or can I use my child's account?

All parents are strongly encouraged to set up their own account. Only a parent account has the privilege to update household information as well as the ability to view all children in a household from a single place. Parents also have the added benefit of receiving district and school wide announcements.

Is my information secure while I view them within the Student/Parent Portal?

Infinite Campus uses SSL (secure socket layer) encryption technology to ensure data is protected while information is in transit. It is similar to what the banking industry is utilizing.

How often is information updated in the Student/Parent Portal?

Attendance information will be updated daily. Grades are updated by your child's teacher(s).

How do I report errors or request update to my information?

Please contact the office.

Is there a mobile app to access Infinite Campus on the go?

Yes, Infinite Campus App is available for download for your iPad, iPhone, iPod and Android devices:

1. Launch the Campus App, select Settings and Enter this District ID: JQZPSD

2. Enter your Campus Portal Username and Password.

School Boundaries Changing

In order to better serve our students and meet the needs of our schools, Des Moines Public Schools adopted new **attendance** areas for our elementary schools. These changes were unanimously approved by the School Board on May 6, 2014. The most significant and positive result in almost every case is that the attendance areas of our elementary, middle and high schools will now better align, creating a more consistent "feeder system" throughout the district. What does this mean for elementary education in Des Moines? Several good things:

- More neighborhood students will be able to attend their neighborhood school
- Enrollment will be better balanced between our school buildings
- Our school buildings will be better utilized
- Elementary schools will be more aligned with our secondary schools

Out of 15,500 elementary students in Des Moines, approximately 8% could be impacted by these proposed changes. However, most will have the option to "grandfather" this change, making the actual number much less.

These changes go into effect for the 2015-16 school year and will affect incoming kindergarten students. Students that are already attending a school have the option to remain in the school under the "grandfathering clause."

2015-2016 School Year PATRON NOTIFICATION

Between District Open Enrollment Iowa Administrative Code 281-17.3(2)

Parents/Guardians considering the use of the open enrollment option to enroll their children in <u>another</u> public school district in the state of Iowa should be aware of the following dates:

DEADLINES:

March 1, 2015 is the last date for regular open enrollment requests for the 2015-2016 school year.

September 1, 2015 is the last date for open enrollment requests for entering kindergarten students and those students falling under the "good cause" definition for the 2015-2016 school year. To insure that the transfer of individual students does not adversely affect the diversity plan of the District, certain limitations to open enrollment have been established. **Parents of kinder**garten students are therefore encouraged to make application requests prior to March 1, 2015.

APPEALS:

Within 30 days of a denial of an open enrollment request by the DMPS Board of Education, a parent/guardian may file an appeal with the state board of education only if the open enrollment request was based on repeated acts of harassment or a serious health condition of the student that the district cannot adequately address. All other denials must be appealed to the district court in Polk County.

ATHLETIC ELIGIBILITY:

In most cases, a high school student who open enrolls is **ineligible** for **varsity** athletic competition during the student's first 90 consecutive school days of enrollment in the receiving district. Some, but not all, exceptions to this general rule of ineligibility are as follows:

The sending district does not offer the sport in question.

The sending district was dissolved and merged with one or more other districts.

The sending district whole-grade shares with another district for the student's grade level.

TRANSPORTATION:

Parents/Guardians of students open enrolled <u>from another school district</u> are eligible for transportation assistance if the household income of the parent/guardian is at or below the federal poverty guidelines for household size. <u>The two districts must be</u> <u>contiguous</u>. Assistance may be in the form of actual transportation or in the form of a cash stipend.
