

A Note From Mrs. Kerper

Dear Families,

As explained in prior newsletters and at a parent meeting this year, Capitol View has received a large School Improvement Grant. We were eligible to apply for this grant last year because Capitol View's achievement data over the past several years has been low. We have hired additional staff members to help coach teachers to become even better teachers. We are learning about how to engage all students and encourage total participation in the classroom. We are also implementing new math materials and using lots of technology to enhance our instruction. These are just a few of the things we are working on.

What can you as parents do to help your student's achievement? One of the first things is to get them here every day on time. I know you have been hearing about our attendance goals and our student incentives. Our attendance so far this year has been improved from last year and last year was improved from the year before. So far we have an attendance rate of 96.6%. We must be above 95% and would like to be above 97%. Your children cannot learn if they are not here. Many of you have worked on this as a family and we have students who have greatly improved from last year. However, since fall break our attendance is slipping and unfortunately we have 54 students who have missed more than five days already and several close to ten. Please help us focus on the importance of being at school every day.

Please pay close attention to the calendar at the left. Students do not have school on the Wednesday before Thanksgiving. This gives you an early start on enjoying that turkey and pumpkin pie.

In addition, there are upcoming days where the 21st Century after school program will not be held due to holidays or teacher meetings. Please make note of these if your children attend the program after school.

Talk to your children this month about what they are thankful for and perhaps they can even write a thank you note to someone.


