Dear Families,

Due to the spring break I am combining the February and March newsletters. Therefore, another one will not be coming until the first of April.

Parent/Teacher conferences are fast approaching. Attending conferences and supporting your child's learning is one of the most important things you can do for him/her. Around February 15th, you should be receiving a yellow note regarding your conference time. Please sign it and send it back to confirm the scheduled time, or contact the school office as soon as possible to reschedule.

Iowa Assessments will be taking place for 3rd, 4th and 5th graders April 3-7 and, if needed, a few days of the second week. Please avoid scheduling any appointments or other events that will result in your child missing school. In addition to Iowa Assessments, ELL students will be taking the Iowa English Language Development Assessment (IELDA) between February 12 and March 9. Please do your best to have your students here on time each day.

In closing, I would also like to reiterate a message from our from School Board chair, Teree Caldwell-Johnson and Superintendent Thomas Ahart, that you can read below. Our Capitol View diversity is a strength and a blessing!




Winter Recess

- Please use our main entrance on E. 16th St. for loading and unloading your students. This section is a ONE WAY, ONE LANE driveway to ensure we are not blocking the parking spots for those needing to enter the building. YOU MAY NOT LEAVE YOUR CAR or park for long periods of time unless you are in a parking spot. When you drop off or pick up your student please pull forward as far as you can so more cars can get in the driveway at a time. We will get your children to you.
- Our bus lane on Capitol Avenue is for buses only. Please do not use this area for drop-off or pick-up before or after school.
- In the afternoon only, K-2 students will be picked up in the front circle facing E 16th and 3rd-5th graders will be picked up in the drive on the south side of the building facing Walnut Street.
- All children should be crossing between the white crosswalk lines at the intersections. They should never be crossing at another area. Please remind your children of this when they are dropped off. This is very important for their safety.
